Looking to the Future

This past year, we have celebrated 50 years of service in Siouxland. We have also made plans for our future, which includes a new health center encompassing:

- Two resident-centered, Medicare-skilled nursing care neighborhoods
- Medicare outpatient therapy
- Assisted living neighborhoods
- Assisted living memory care neighborhood
- Infrastructure support for Sunlight and Bernstein memory care communities

State-of-the-art in every way, the new health center will feature intimate, person-centered nursing neighborhoods and strengthen our community that values residents first. Overall, the cost of the new health center project is approximately \$14.5 million—including site development and financing, but not demolition of the existing health center. The impact of our new health center translates into a more vibrant Sunrise community. It also generates significant economic benefits to the Siouxland economy, both today and in years to come.

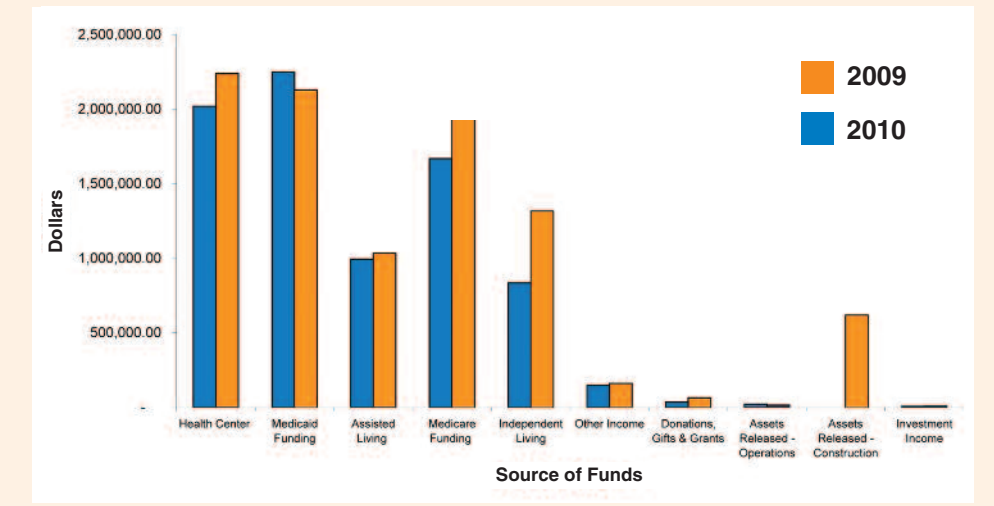

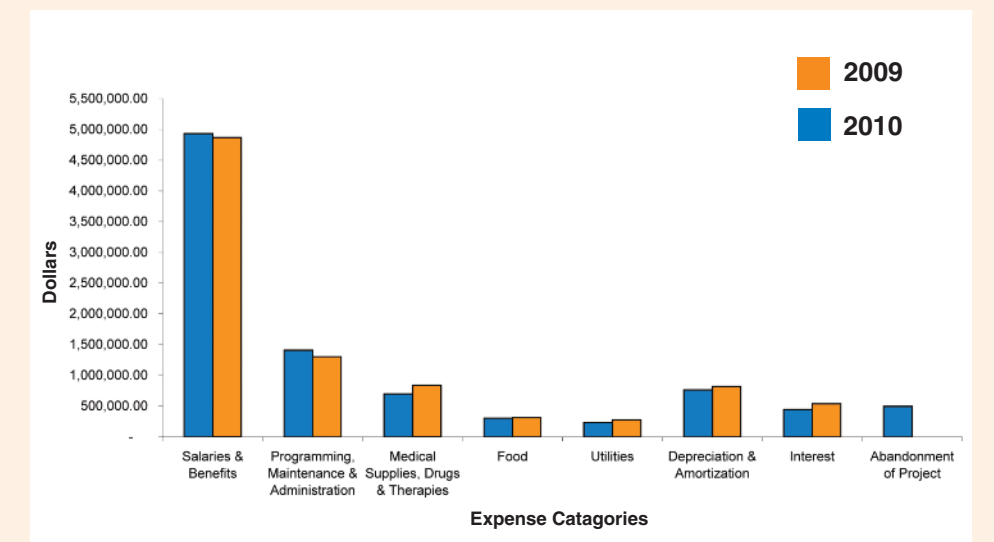

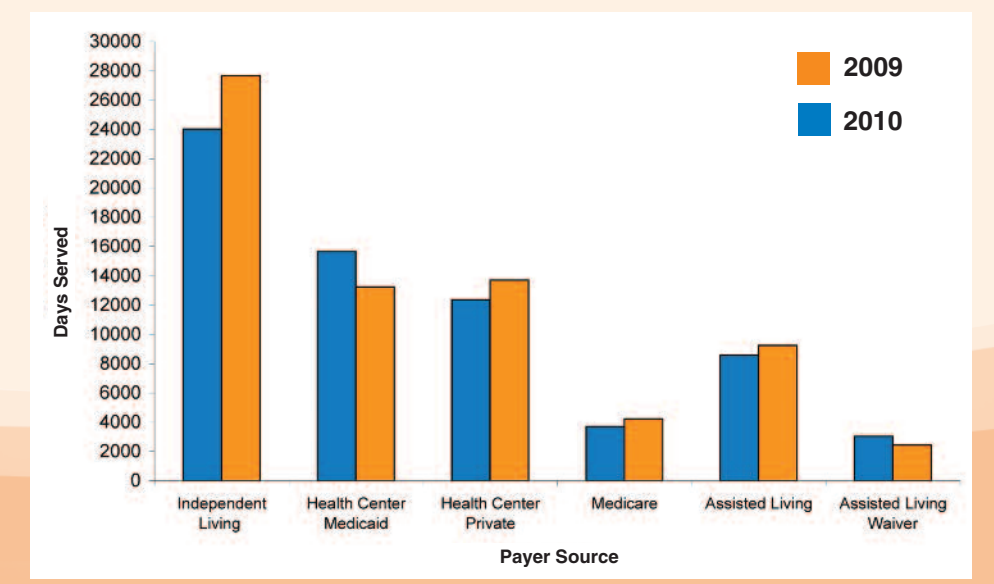
